



Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from B.A. Students




Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from M.A. Students





Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from B.Sc. students




Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from M.Sc. students





Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from B.Com. students




Feedback about Review and design of Syllabus from M.Com. students

For feedback we have clustered the students as per their classes like graduation first, second and third year, post graduation previous and final year and then a feedback is taken from 10% of total students in each class using random sampling method and the data has been interpreted and represented in the form of bar graphs for each class, which shows that maximum no. of students in each class are agreeing for well structured design of syllabus, achievement of leaning and course outcomes, relevance of prescribed books and notes, positive classroom environment and possible career building with the courses taken.

Analysis Report on the Teachers' Feedback received (2020-21)

We have received feedback from 84 numbers of Teachers'.

The following are the observations on teachers' feedback;

Alumni Feedback Regarding Syllabus


SESSION: 2020-21

Feedback of the Alumni is an essential component for analysis and improvement in the higher education academic culture. Once out of the formal structure, the Alumni can objectively talk about the challenges faced by them

The Alumni Committee of the college collects feedback form from the Alumni pertaining to the varied aspects of the curriculum studied. The feedback forms have been designed. They are required to submit their responses to a set of eight statements on a 5-point Likert Scale in which choices range from Strongly Disagree (1) to Strongly Agree (5). The feedback thus received is then analyzed by the Committee and shared with the Principal, IQAC and the faculty for discussion. ALUMNI FEEDBACK REGARDING SYLLABUS



Statement 1: Relevance of Syllabus to Professional Life

Majority of the alumni i.e. 35.0 percent agreed and 42.5 percent of alumni strongly agreed that the syllabus studied was relevant to their professional life, 13.8 percent students held a neutral opinion in this regard.

Statement 2: Regular Revision of the Content of Syllabus

50.0 percent alumni strongly agreed and 35.0 percent alumni agreed that the content of the syllabus was revised at reasonable intervals. On the other hand, 11.3 percent alumni held a neutral opinion in this context.

Statement 3: Value Based Learning

41.3 percent of the alumni agreed and 37.5 percent of alumni strongly agreed that the syllabus imparted value-based learning in terms of skill, concepts, knowledge and critical thinking in them while 11.3 percent alumni have neutral response in this regard.

Statement 4: Well defined Aims and Objectives of Syllabus

35.0 percent of alumni strongly agreed and 25.0 percent agreed that the aims and objectives of the syllabus were well defined and clear to the teachers and alumni. On the other hand, 23.8 percent held a neutral opinion in context.

Statement 5: Enhancement of Subject Knowledge

Majority of alumni i.e. 35.0 percent strongly agreed and 38.8 percent of alumni agreed that the syllabus increased their knowledge and understanding of the subject studied. 12.5 percent alumni held neutral response in this regard.

Statement 6: Relevant and Updated Books

27.5 percent of alumni strongly agreed and 27.5 percent alumni agreed that the prescribed books were relevant, updated and appropriate. On the other hand, 25.0 percent held a neutral opinion in this context.

Statement 7: Syllabus Enhancing Practical Competencies

23.8 percent of the alumni strongly agreed and 31.3 percent alumni agreed that the syllabus enhanced their practical competencies while 26.3 percent alumni gave a neutral response in this regard.

Statement 8: Need Based Syllabus as per Job Requirement

32.5 percent alumni strongly agreed and 25.0 percent agreed that the syllabus need based as per the requirement of the job/industry. On the other hand, 22.5 percent held a neutral opinion in this context


Feedback about design and review of syllabus from B.A IIIrd year students



Feedback about design and review of syllabus from M.A 1ST year student




Feedback about design and review of syllabus from M.A IInd year student




Feedback about design and review of syllabus from B. Sc IST year students




Feedback about design and review of syllabus from B. Sc IInd year students




Feedback about design and review of syllabus from B. Sc IIIrd year students


Feedback about design and review of syllabus from M. Sc II year students














Feedback about design and review of syllabus from B. Com IIIrd year students





Alumni Feedback Regarding Syllabus



Statement 1: Relevance of Syllabus to Professional Life

Majority of the alumni i.e. 50.0 percent agreed and 35.0 percent of alumni strongly agreed that the syllabus studied was relevant to their professional life, 11.3 percent students held a neutral opinion in this regard.

Statement 2: Regular Revision of the Content of Syllabus

35.0 percent alumni strongly agreed and 42.5 percent alumni agreed that the content of the syllabus was revised at reasonable intervals. On the other hand, 13.8 percent alumni held a neutral opinion in this context.

Statement 3: Value Based Learning

38.8 percent of the alumni agreed and 35.0 percent of alumni strongly agreed that the syllabus imparted value-based learning in terms of skill, concepts, knowledge and critical thinking in them while 12.5 percent alumni have neutral response in this regard.

Statement 4: Well defined Aims and Objectives of Syllabus

35.0 percent of alumni strongly agreed and 25.0 percent agreed that the aims and objectives of the syllabus were well defined and clear to the teachers and alumni. On the other hand, 23.8 percent held a neutral opinion in context.

Statement 5: Enhancement of Subject Knowledge

Majority of alumni i.e. 37.5 percent strongly agreed and 41.3 percent of alumni agreed that the syllabus increased their knowledge and understanding of the subject studied. 11.3 percent alumni held neutral response in this regard.

Statement 6: Relevant and Updated Books

23.8 percent of alumni strongly agreed and 31.3 percent alumni agreed that the prescribed books were relevant, updated and appropriate. On the other hand, 26.3 percent held a neutral opinion in this context.

Statement 7: Syllabus Enhancing Practical Competencies

32.5 percent of the alumni strongly agreed and 25.0 percent alumni agreed that the syllabus enhanced their practical competencies while 22.5 percent alumni gave a neutral response in this regard.

Statement 8: Need Based Syllabus as per Job Requirement


