As a constituent of Dr. Rammanohar Lohia Avadh University, we strictly follow the university's curriculum and course structure, fully aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP). The college is well-equipped to integrate arts, science, and commerce into its programs, offering creative and adaptable curricula as per the university-approved guidelines. We take pride in our vibrant extracurricular activities, with active National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadet Corps (NCC), and ECO clubs that contribute to the holistic development of our students. Additionally, the college adheres to the university's four-year curriculum design, which provides multiple entry and exit points. This flexible structure caters to the diverse needs and aspirations of students, enabling them to choose academic paths that align with their goals. Our college is fully committed to offering an inclusive, dynamic, and forward-thinking educational experience to foster academic excellence and personal growth.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Parent University of our college has successfully registered in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) account under the Government of India, a significant initiative aimed at enhancing the educational experience for students. The Governing Body has entrusted the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) with the responsibility of motivating students to register themselves in the ABC system. This will enable students to access the benefits of credit transfer, offering greater flexibility and opportunities in their academic journey. To ensure that students are well-informed about the importance of this registration, the IQAC, in collaboration with the Office of the Principal, has taken proactive steps to raise awareness. Several awareness programs and sessions are being conducted to explain the benefits of credit transfer, including the flexibility it provides for students to transfer their earned credits between institutions. The registration in ABC will also facilitate the recognition of academic achievements across various educational institutions, making it easier for students to pursue further studies or seek employment without facing barriers due to credit non-recognition. By encouraging students to register in the ABC, the college aims to help them take full advantage of this innovative initiative, enhancing their academic mobility and ensuring they benefit from the progressive changes in the Indian education system.

17.Skill development:

The college follows a comprehensive curriculum designed by its parent university, offering a variety of courses aimed at enhancing students' skills and knowledge. Among the key offerings are Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), which focus on developing practical skills across different fields. These courses help students gain competencies that complement their academic knowledge and prepare them for professional challenges. Additionally, the college provides Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) that include Major Indian Languages such as English, Hindi, and Sanskrit. These language courses promote linguistic proficiency and cultural awareness, enabling students to communicate effectively in both national and global contexts. Environmental Studies (EVS) is another important part of the AEC, fostering awareness about environmental issues and sustainability. The college also emphasizes the development of language skills through its Language Lab, where students can improve their communication abilities and enhance their overall learning experience. To further support career development, the college offers more than 35 Add On certificate courses that focus on practical, discipline-specific abilities. These certificate programs are designed to give students an edge in their chosen fields, helping them develop a strong, practical attitude and gain specialized knowledge that is highly valued in the professional world.

At the undergraduate level, the study of Sanskrit and Hindi is fostered, helping preserve these ancient languages while enabling students to gain deeper insights into India's linguistic and literary traditions. The Department of History is instrumental in imparting knowledge about India's glorious past, offering courses that cover Ancient, Medieval, and Modern Indian history. Through this comprehensive curriculum, students gain an understanding of India's historical evolution, socio-cultural dynamics, and heritage. Furthermore, the Political Science and Economics departments enrich students' understanding of Indian governance, political thought, and economic perspectives, drawing heavily from the wisdom of ancient Indian philosophers such as Acharya Kautilya. His teachings on governance, ethics, and economy provide a strong foundation for students to engage with

contemporary issues. By integrating Indian languages, history, philosophy, and governance into its academic framework, our institution upholds the vision of the NEP 2020, ensuring that students not only appreciate India's cultural legacy but also contribute to its preservation and advancement.

At the beginning of each session, students are thoroughly oriented, ensuring they understand the outcomes of their courses. Additionally, students are given the flexibility to choose their generic elective courses based on their personal interests and career aspirations. This approach fosters greater student engagement and aligns with the evolving demands of the job market. The students are also well-acquainted with their syllabus, which is designed to cater to the current needs of the competitive job market. Beyond the core syllabus, the college offers over 35 add-on courses that provide additional skills and knowledge relevant to emerging trends in various industries. These courses help bridge the gap between academic learning and industry requirements, thereby enhancing the employability and preparedness of students for future careers.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution offers distance education through study centres affiliated with IGNOU and UPRTOU, catering to students who cannot pursue regular courses. These study centres provide access to both undergraduate and postgraduate programs, ensuring educational opportunities for a wider audience. The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly accelerated the adoption of online education, introducing many to the benefits of virtual learning platforms that were previously reserved for a select group. The flexibility of virtual learning has been particularly beneficial for those unable to attend regular classes due to geographical or personal constraints.

This transition has led to the rise of hybrid classes, which combine the best aspects of both traditional and online education. Hybrid classes offer greater flexibility, accommodating students' diverse needs and ensuring maximum attendance. At the start of each academic year, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) reviews the syllabus of all subjects, formulates the academic calendar, and incorporates Information and Communication Technology (ICT) tools in the</p>	

evaluation process.

In line with university guidelines, the Principal directs departments to distribute courses and organize academic activities, resulting in the preparation of a detailed timetable. The college conducts an induction program to orient students with institutional operations and resources. Faculty members are encouraged to use e-learning resources, maintain course files, and participate in development programs to enhance teaching effectiveness. Adequate infrastructure, including ICT facilities, supports teaching and evaluation.

Each teacher prepares a teaching plan aligned with the syllabus and timetable, shared with students via notice boards and WhatsApp groups. The Academic Counseling Cell, as part of IQAC, ensures effective curriculum delivery. Various teaching methods, such as smart classrooms, PowerPoint presentations, quizzes, remedial classes, and industrial visits, are employed. 1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

Our college emphasizes key cross-cutting issues such as gender, environment, sustainability, human values, and professional ethics

across various academic programs. Gender sensitization and human values are integrated into the curriculum through a compulsory foundation course, which includes poems, stories, and seminars that address gender concerns. The Women and Gender Development cell also runs flagship programs that focus on gender equality, with students required to participate for CCE marks. In addition, the college promotes ethical development through programs aimed at enhancing students' character and fostering self-reflection.

Environmental education is mandated through a foundation course on Environmental Science, which covers topics like biodiversity, pollution, and sustainable practices. The curriculum also incorporates professional ethics, particularly in UG and PG courses related to entrepreneurship and project management, including intellectual property issues.

Science students in Zoology and Biology gain insights into environmental sustainability and ethics, while students in the Arts streams (Education, English, Sociology, Economics, Political Science, and Commerce) explore gender, culture, and ethics. Furthermore, under the NEP 2020 framework, cross-cutting issues are taught as compulsory subjects in co-curricular programs across all undergraduate disciplines, ensuring that students are equipped to address these challenges in various contexts.

to university norms. The internal exams are valued at 25 marks, while the university exam is worth 75 marks. CIAs include written exams, multiple-choice questions, quizzes, presentations, assignments, and projects.

Summative assessments are designed to align with Course Outcomes and pedagogical goals, with question papers reviewed by the Exam Committee and Department Heads before release. Results are published by the exam in-charge, followed by performance analysis at the department level to assess goal achievement.

Solid waste management at S. L. B. S. Degree College is well-structured to minimize pollution and its impact on health and the

environment. Solid waste is categorized into biodegradable, non-biodegradable, and hazardous waste. Biodegradable waste, such as food scraps and canteen waste, is collected and composted on campus to produce fertilizer, which is used in the college gardens. Non-biodegradable wastes, like plastics, tins, and glass bottles, are regularly collected by staff and disposed of through municipal services. Hazardous wastes, including chemicals from laboratories and cleaning materials, are handled with special care to prevent harm to health and the environment.

For liquid waste management, the college generates two main types of waste: sewage and wastewater from science laboratories, hostels, and the canteen. Sewage is managed through standard waste disposal systems, while the wastewater from other areas is treated before being released or disposed of. In addition, paper waste, which is significant in administrative offices, academic blocks, and other areas, is managed by vendors who ensure its proper recycling or disposal. The college takes steps to reduce the usage of plastics and encourages responsible waste management practices across all departments.
