## **“NATIONAL SECURITY & FOREIGN POLICY”**

**Dated 10.10.2023**

The objective of this seminar were to study the current challenges towards our National Security and to aware the students how vigilant should a nation to tackle these challenges by our security preparedness and of course by diplomatic channels under our foreign policy measures.

### **Introduction**

Security, just a word has a great sense in the context of a nation. Issue of security is the basic requirement for all human being but national security is the primary duty & responsibility of all countrymen. The problem of internal or external security can't be treated as a mere law and order problem or anything else, it have a bigger dimension and should be recognized as such but the thinking about national security issues have been, by and largely confined solely to the relevant government department and various security and intelligence agencies. On the other hand, in many countries these issues are treated as vice versa.

Number of factors conditions the National Security of a State and it is difficult to ascertain which of the two threats-external or internal - will pose greater security threat to the country going forward. If we consider a nation as an organism, to fight an external adversary, internal insurgency successfully is a greater and immediate challenge than fighting wars abroad. The internal cohesion with the people support is the basic requisite for the external defense preparedness with which a nation can deter a potential aggressor to preserve freedom. The history of the world has shown thought

millennia, that the freedom and riches were lost by neglecting the boundaries or through internal factionalism.

In the inaugural session, Prof. Ravindra Kumar, Principal, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Degree College, Gonda have congrats the Deptt of Defence & Strategic Studies and orated about his thinking that National Security as paramount and said it is necessary for any kind of development and stability taking place in the nation. He said, today India has been able to make so much progress because our borders are secure and we are getting a fear-free environment to achieve any goal of peaceful development. We cannot achieve any of the nation's research and development goals unless we are safe.

In the first technical session Dr. BN Pandey, while congratulating the Department of Defence Studies of the College for organizing the seminar on this topic of special importance of 'National Security and Foreign Policy', laid great emphasis on the relevance of the topic.

He emphasized the following points in his lecture:

1. Keeping national security in mind, the main objective of Indian foreign policy is to protect the territorial integrity, protect the borders, counter terrorism, as well as focus on food security and energy security.
2. To strengthen relations with developed nations, so that India can develop a modern world class infrastructure through foreign partnership, foreign direct investment, technology transfer.
3. India's foreign policy is based on the concept of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam which emphasizes on values like Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas.
4. India's foreign policy has never been related to imperial expansion, nor does India believe in interfering in the internal affairs of other countries.
5. India's foreign policy is primarily based on maintaining friendly relations with all nations, keeping in mind its interests, recognizing the principles of immediate neighborhood and extended neighbourhood.

Prof. RBS Baghel, Head, Department of Defence & Strategic Studies expressed his views on the importance of nuclear weapons and the immediate reasons for their invention in expanding our power under national security and capable of creating intimidation for the adversaries.

After lunch in second technical session Dr. D K Shukla, Assistant Professor, Department of Defence & Strategic Studies said that Pakistan supported terrorism is the main reason for the problems prevailing between the two countries under India-Pakistan relations. He said that today India is successfully conducting various aspects of its foreign policy and Pakistan is trapped in the web of problems due to its negative thinking.

Dr A K Shukla, Assistant Professor, Department of Defence & Strategic Studies expressed his views on various internal aspects under national security and called it very important. He said that unless a nation is free from challenges from within, it cannot be free from external challenges. Be it the violence prevalent in the north-eastern states of India today or the challenges of Naxalism or any other problem, its seriousness cannot be denied. We must eradicate the problems by strengthening the information gathering aspects of our security system. Only then will we be able to achieve all the goals of peaceful development.

At the end of the program, Dr. Dharmendra Kumar Shukla, Assistant Professor, Department of Defence & Strategic Studies expressed his gratitude to Key Note speaker Dr B.N. Pandey sir, Prof. Ravindra Kumar, Principal Sir, Prof. RBS Baghel, Head, Department of Defence & Strategic Studies and Chief Proctor, Prof R.S. Singh Sir, Co-ordinator, IQAC, Prof. Jitendra Singh, HoD, Deptt of Physics, Dr. Arun Verma, Head, Deptt of Physical Education and all the departmental colleagues, including the guests, and gave good wishes to the students.
